- 1. PRESENTATION ON MOBILITY MATTERS PROGRAM BY KURT MCKENZIE, DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT AND ELAINE WELCH, CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER.**  
*A correction to Kurt's last name is Harris as noted today. Elaine Welch presentation covered the criteria and services provided with the mobility matters program. This program provides free, one-on-one, door-through-door rides provided by screened trained volunteer drivers. Rides provided are primarily for medical care, dental and grocery shopping trips for qualified clients. Qualifications for this program are: 60 years and older, live in Contra Costa County, able to walk with the aid of a cane, walker, knee scooter, crutches, or elbow assistance, require escorted, door-through-door assistance, able to calling and request rides, unable to use other forms of transportation for medical care and basic necessities, like grocery shopping.
