SUBJECT: Policy Development

Policy Development

The next community workshop will be hosted at Centre Concord on Thursday, July 30th at 5:30pm, focusing on forming goals, objectives and policies.

The workshop will be an interactive discussion with breakout groups. Each table will have a facilitator responsible for moderating the group discussion. Participants will be asked to respect each other's viewpoints and keep their discussion relevant to the task given. Each group will be asked to find common ground and general consensus on the goals, objectives, and policies they develop. The workshop seeks to get feedback directly from participants on what they would like to see in the plan.

Centre Concord is located at 5298 Clayton Rd. The workshop will be held in the center portion of the main hall. County Connection Bus Route 10 connects Centre Concord with the downtown Concord BART station every 30 minutes on weekday evenings. A bike valet will also be available for participants who ride to the event.

Vision, Goals, Objectives and Policies

The next phase of the Bicycle, Pedestrian, and Safe Routes to Transit Plan's progress will focus on the formation of goals, objectives, and policies (Attachment 2).

- Goals are broad statements that express general priorities. Goals should support our vision and describe the most important aspects of our priorities and attitudes. Goals are formulated based on the identification of key issues, opportunities, and problems that affect walking, bicycling and transit access.
- **Objectives** are more specific than goals and are usually attainable through strategic planning and implementation activities. Objectives should direct the way public improvements are made, where resources are allocated, how programs are operated,

and how City priorities are determined. Implementation of an objective contributes to the fulfillment of a goal.

• **Policies** are the rules and courses of action used to ensure plan implementation. Policies often accomplish a number of objectives. Policies are actions that guide the City to achieve the objectives and goals.

The plan's goals, objectives and policies should address the identified community needs.

Next Steps

The next scheduled PAC meeting will be on Monday, August 24, 2015 at 5:30pm in the Permit Center Conference Room. The PAC meets on the fourth Monday of the month. We will provide a report on the results of the policy formation workshop held on July 30th. Following this workshop, staff will be focusing on best practices and standards. There will not be a need for a PAC meeting every month this fall; staff will notify the Committee and the public well in advance of any future meeting cancelations.

Goals

Goals should support your vision and describe the most important aspects of priorities and attitudes.

Examples:

- * Develop a comprehensive bikeway network.
- * Improve bicycling and walking safety and comfort.
- * Increase the number of commute, recreation and utilitarian bicycling and walking trips.
- * Increase the number of high quality support facilities to complement the bicycle network and walkway facilities.
- * Increase education and awareness of the value of bicycle and pedestrian travel for commute and non-commute trips.

Objectives

Objectives should direct the way public improvements are made, where resources are allocated, how programs are operated, and how City priorities are determined.

Examples:

- * Increase the mileage of transportation bikeway facilities miles by 50 percent by 2020.
- * Provide high quality facilities based on best practices.
- * Increase the number of bicycle and pedestrian support facilities.
- * Reduce bicycle and pedestrian related collisions, injuries and fatalities.
- * Increase the number of bicycle and pedestrian support facilities.

Policies

Policies should be actions that guide the City to achieve the objectives and goals.

Examples:

Goal 1: Develop a comprehensive bikeway network.

Objective 1.1: Increase the mileage of transportation bikeway facilities miles by 50 percent by 2020.

Policy 1.1.1: Develop a 20-year implementation strategy for the Concord Bicycle, Pedestrian, and Safe Routes to Transit Plan.

Goal 2: Improve bicycling and walking safety and comfort.

Objective 2.1: Provide high quality facilities based on best practices.

Policy 2.1.1: Develop facilities through the use of standard and appropriate innovative treatments as provided in the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices or the National Association of City Transportation Officials (NACTO)

Urban Bikeway Design Guide and other such guidelines and standards.
