First new shopping center in years coming to Concord

Next year, Concord will be home to the first new shopping center built in this area in many years. CenterCal Properties is about to transform the former Chevron campus on Diamond Boulevard into a 375,000-square-foot shopping center called The Veranda. The 30-acre site is next to the recently renovated Willows Shopping Center and not far from several new restaurants that were built in the last year. The activity in the area reflects the growing popularity of Concord as companies seek to locate along the I-680 corridor.

CenterCal will demolish the outdated office buildings on the site this summer with the goal of opening the shopping center in 2017. The center will be unique in that CenterCal is seeking tenants that do not already have locations in this

area, including chef-driven restaurants, a movie theater serving meals and other new experiences for visitors.

The first tenant, announced last month, is 365 by Whole Foods. Whole Foods created the 365 concept to help meet the demand for more natural and organic foods. The name refers to the company's belief that healthy, fresh, affordable food should be readily available every day of the year.

The Concord location is the first in the East Bay and second in the Bay Area. Whole Foods has signed a total of 11 additional leases in Evergreen Park, Illinois; Gainesville, Florida; Bellevue Washington; Cedar Park, Texas; Cincinnati, Ohio; Houston, Texas;

Concord officials set meeting to select master developer

The Concord City Council will hold its regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, April 5 at the Concord Senior Center beginning at 6:30 p.m. to select the master developer for Phase 1 of the Concord Naval Weapons Station Reuse Plan. City Council meetings are usually held in the Council Chamber at Civic Center, 1950 Parkside Dr. The change of venue has been made to accommodate the large number of residents expected to attend. The Senior Center is located at 2727 Parkside Circle.

At the meeting, staff will make a report followed by presentations by the two developer finalists, Catellus Development Company and Lennar Concord LLC. Councilmembers will

hear the presentations, ask questions of the finalists and take public comment before deliberating on the selection of the master developer. In the event a decision cannot be reached at the April 5 meeting, the Mayor will continue the meeting to Wednesday, April 13 at 6:30 p.m. in the City Council Chamber.

The meeting will be televised on Concord Cable TV channel 28 (Comcast), 29 (Astound), and 99 (AT&T U-verse) and will be available for viewing on demand from the City's website, www.cityofconcord.org.

Portland, Oregon; and Claremont, Los Alamitos, San Francisco and Santa Monica, California.

CenterCal's design for the center includes plazas to serve as gathering places, with fountains and landscaping to create an inviting environment that encourages visitors to relax and enjoy the setting.

Over the next several months, CenterCal will be announcing additional tenants as leases are signed. The project is another bright spot in Concord's continued recovery from the recession. ♦

Spray Park makes a splash in May

The wildly popular Meadow Homes Spray Park at 1351 Detroit Ave. will open for the 2016 season on Saturday, May 28 and run through Sunday, September 25.

While school is in session, hours will be 3 to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday, and noon to 6 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. After school is in recess for the summer, hours will be noon to 6 p.m., seven days a week.

While the City of Concord is very aware that the drought may not be over in spite of El Niño and the recent rains, the spray park is designed to filter, treat and recycle the water it uses.

Last year, the spray park was closed for several hours multiple times due to

equipment malfunctions. Because there is not a staff person on site, staff relied on the public to leave messages about outages on a special hotline. This year, staff has taken several steps to provide greater reliability and better noticing of the public when the water features are not operating.

Public Works staff has installed a controller that will allow remote monitoring and automated messages if the spray park water quality is outside of normal parameters. The new controller will allow staff to respond to changing conditions at the spray park without having to rely on messages from the public through the hotline. In addition, new signage will provide more information to users.

“By having this remote capability there will be much less reliance on the hotline than in years past,” said Public Works Director Justin Ezell. “We anticipate the changes we have made to the system will make it much more reliable.” ♦

Concord recognized as one of the best places in the world to retire

Concord has been in the international and national news recently. Last month, the esteemed Condé Nast Traveler magazine named Concord one of the 10 best places in the world to retire. Concord joined a list that included cities in Mexico, Portugal, Malaysia, Panama, Belize and Ireland. Here’s what Conde Nast had to say about Concord:

“Located only 30 miles east of San Francisco, Concord is a big little city, home to farmers markets, excellent health care facilities, and free community activities throughout the year. Other bonuses are its location on the BART (Bay Area Rapid Transit) system, and a crime rate below that of San Francisco, despite its proximity

and connection to the city. Concord is also one of the few U.S. cities to have a working drive-in theater, which is perfect for indulging in an evening of nostalgia.”

Nationally, Concord has been recognized by U-Haul International as the company’s #1 U.S. Growth City. U-Haul’s criterion is based on the number of people who rent a U-Haul vehicle in one city and return it to another city. According to U-Haul, people rented U-Hauls elsewhere and returned them to Concord U-Haul locations at a higher rate than anywhere else in the country!

U-Haul locations here saw 57.2 percent of truck rental customers coming into the city as opposed to leaving. Concord brewery surge part of state-wide phenomenon

Concord is gaining a Bay Area reputation for its craft breweries and its growing beer scene. The city is part of a state-wide phenomenon where the California Craft Brewers Association counts almost 600 craft breweries with another 250 in the planning stages. In 2014 craft breweries in California contributed \$6.5 billion to the state's economy.

"In the last four years, we've seen a surge of craft beer businesses locating in Concord," says Economic Development Manager John Montag. "From my conversations with the owners, I learned that they are drawn here by our willingness to work with them to establish their breweries and taprooms, by available space, and by the number of beer enthusiasts in the area."

A stroll around Todos Santos Plaza in the downtown leads to the E.J. Phair Concord Alehouse at 2151 Salvio St. The brewpub offers a wide selection of craft beers on tap and as well as a full menu of lunch and dinner choices. The company's beer is brewed at its second location in Pittsburg and delivered fresh from the source.

Next door is Hop Grenade, a taproom and home of the Brewing Network, a multimedia resource for brewers and beer lovers producing live beer radio shows, podcasts, video, and events. The owners host an annual Brews Fest in Todos Santos Plaza that draws over 50 breweries serving over 100 different beers.

Joining the downtown scene this summer is the Hop Heavy Brewing Company, just one block away at 2115 Pacheco Street. This newest addition grew out of owner Max Brown's home brewing adventures. He is building a new brewery and taproom on the premises where he hopes to share his love of hop-heavy beers.

But downtown is not the only place to sample hand-crafted brews. Black Diamond Brewery has been in Concord for over 10 years. While their label is served in many fine establishments and through retailers throughout the state and beyond, beer lovers can sample their wares fresh from the tap at 2460 Bates Ave.

Not far from Black Diamond is a new entry into the brewery enclave. Epidemic Ales opened its brewery and taproom in January at 150 Mason Circle, Suite J. Epidemic is another business that grew out of home brewing when three couples decided they could turn their hobby, and the thing that they loved to do most, into a full-time business.

Concord has another strong catalyst for beer enthusiast looking to brew their own beer or make the move to commercial brewing. More Beer at 995 Detroit Ave. is a one-stop shop that supplies everything the new or experienced brewer needs from yeast to boilermakers. The company also offers classes, starter kits and advice.

Concord is happy to see the expanding craft beer movement emerging in several areas of the city.

"We're always ready to assist startup businesses in getting established in Concord," says Montag. "We are seeing more and more owners contacting us as prices rise in San Francisco and Oakland. Concord is a good fit for craft and high-tech manufacturers." ♦

New bicycle racks installed downtown

It just got easier to ride your bike downtown. Six new bicycle racks have been installed on Salvio Street between Mt. Diablo Street and Galindo Street. Concord obtained grant funding through 511 Contra Costa last July to purchase the racks. Additional bicycle racks will be installed at two new locations in the downtown later this spring.

A series of stakeholder meetings was held prior to selecting locations for the downtown bicycle racks. As a part of the process, staff conducted a site survey and identified up to 22 potential locations near Todos Santos Plaza. These locations were presented and approved at the November 11 Todos Santos Business Association meeting.

It is the third year that Concord has applied for and received the 511 grant. Staff installed six new bicycle racks in the downtown parking garages and another six at the Civic Center during the previous cycles in 2013 and 2014. In June, staff plans to start working on the fourth cycle of grant funding. If awarded, the new racks will be installed this fall.

Renovation complete at center

Centre Concord, the popular 23,000 square-foot community center at 5298 Clayton Rd., has reopened after undergoing a much-needed renovation. The ballroom was refurbished with new moveable walls and wall coverings; extensive upgrades were made to the bathrooms, lobby and parking lot to make them ADA compliant.

The ballroom, which accommodates up to 400 people and has a full kitchen, is available for wedding receptions, quinceañeras, fundraisers, seminars, meetings and trade shows. A number of smaller classrooms can also be rented. Approximately 50,000 people use the facility annually.

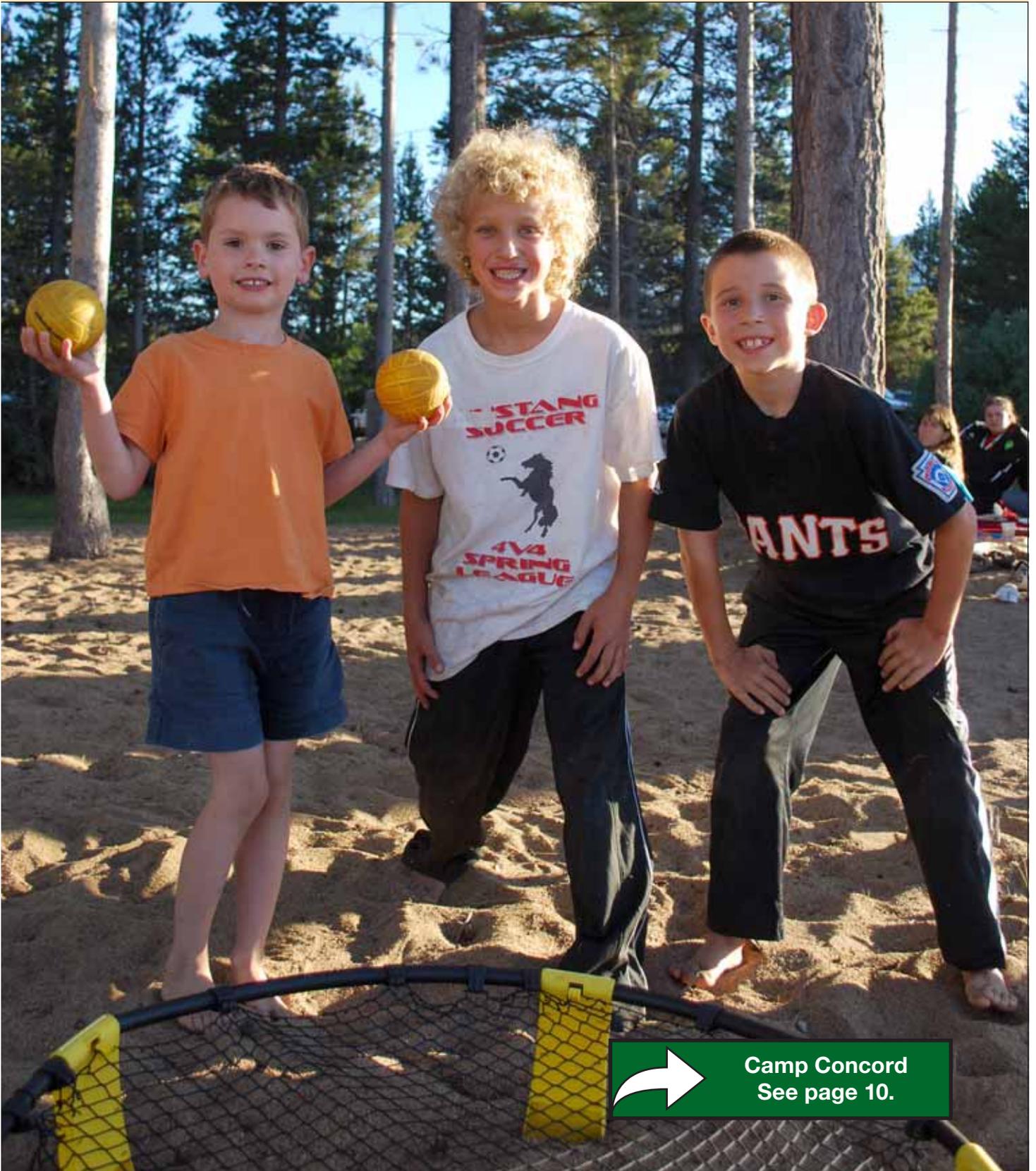

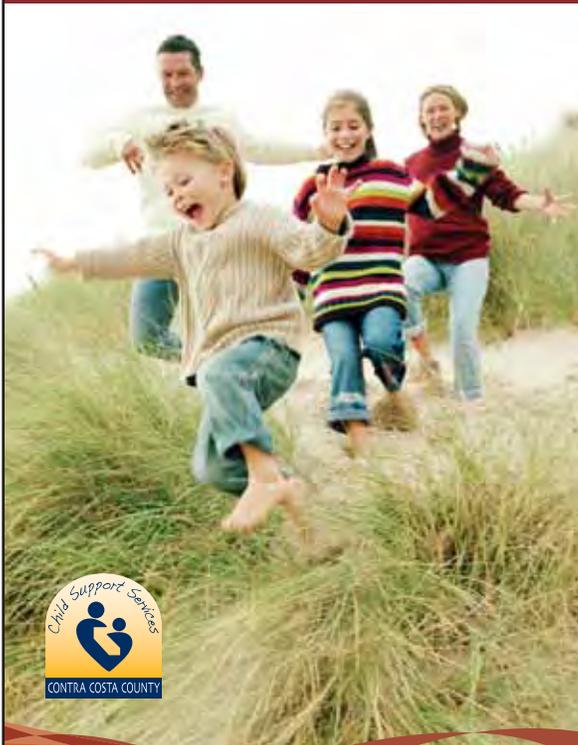

MODERATE

Up to 4 blocks of walking and some incline and/or steps involved. Resting areas available at end of tour. Standing approximately 1 hour periodically over the day. Not appropriate for walkers and wheelchairs.



STRENUOUS

More than 4 blocks of walking with many stairs and uneven terrain. No resting areas available for long periods of time. More than 1 hour of standing. Not appropriate for canes, walkers or wheelchairs.

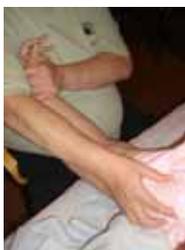

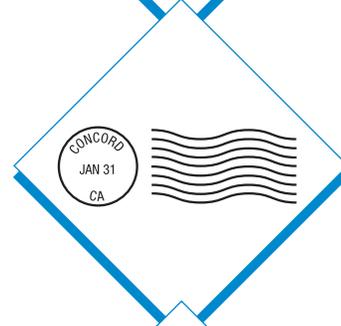

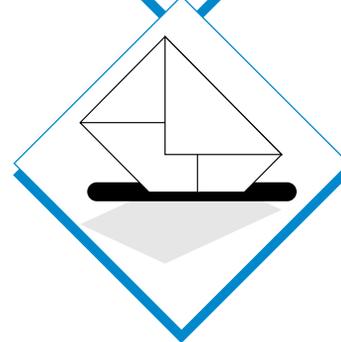
