- a. **Review** – of Mount Diablo Resource Recovery Special Extraordinary Rate Adjustment Request. **Report by Craig Blythe, Administrative Services Manager.**

Action: Craig Blythe provided introductory comments. Staff and City Consultant Rose Radford of R3 Consulting provided information on the study results of the Mt. Diablo Resource Recovery (MDRR) requested special extraordinary increase. Committee engaged Staff, R3, and Sal Evola of MDRR in a question and answer session. Staff presented a rate comparison of all 19 jurisdictions in Contra Costa County. Committee members requested that staff provide Council with any available information regarding jurisdictions in Contra Costa County that have factored in costs for SB 1383 implementation into their rates. Committee members also requested that staff provide Council with pricing comparison graphs for each cart size. Committee recommends approval of the special extraordinary increase of 1.95%.

NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC

There is a 90-day limit for the filing of a challenge in the Superior Court to certain City administrative decisions and orders which require a hearing by law, the receipt of evidence, and the exercise of discretion. The 90-day limit begins on the date the decision is final (Code of Civil Procedure §1094.6). Further, if you challenge an action taken by the City Council in court, you may be limited by California law to raising only those issues you or someone else raised in the hearing or in a written correspondence delivered to the City Council prior to or at the hearing.
